Young Eagles Day

Wow! I want to be a pilot! Were some of the words echoed by over 30 Hawkins County young people as they participated in the third

young eagles program conducted this year at Hawkins county airport. The Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Chapter 442 had

five pilots flying 32 youth between the ages of 8 and 17, four adults and five young people Saturday from 10am to 2pm. It was a great day for flying and many showed up to enjoy their first hands-on flying experience. The Young Eagles program is a national program that started in 1998. Since then the members of EAA have flown over 1.5 million young people. In addition to the five pilots (three of which are not Hawkins county residents) there were four ground crew doing the registration and picture taking and several other members helping with traffic flow, flight line safety and cooking. The only cost to the young pilot and their families was a donation if they partook of the hamburgers, hotdogs and snacks that were available. Here is one young man though, too young to participate in the Young Eagles program who wanted to fly, and in a couple of years will have that opportunity with EAA.
